**Meet Rev. Dr. Ken Neilson,
Parish development officer**

In addition to being a certified marriage and family therapist and a deacon in the Church of the Nazarene, Ken holds a Doctor of Ministry degree from Acadia Divinity College (Acadia University), and with his wife Fay owns and operates *InTheStillness*, a retreat centre located in beautiful

West Quaco, near St. Martins.

While not technically an Anglican himself, Ken has been actively involved in the life of our Diocese for some time. He has been a source of counsel and spiritual direction for a number of Anglican ministers in our region, both lay and ordained. He has taught at Taylor College with Threshold Ministries, and has provided training in Facilitated Conciliation for leaders in our diocese called to support parishes facing significant crisis and/or conflict.

Ken, 59 and a native of Saint John, says his role as parish development officer will be one of support.

“I will be helping support the deaneries to action the charge of the bishop,” he said. “I will be supporting the parish leaders, equipping and empowering them in missional initiatives — how to reach out into their parishes.”

Ken’s personal statement of faith: "We must actively seek the face of God and then put that into action. You can't have part one without part two. You become insular with only part one. If you really know the heart of God, you're compelled to go out and act."
