ISAIAH 58:1-9A – *The LORD calls upon Isaiah to make it clear to his people that true religion is more than just the observance of ceremonies and fasts. It is more important to see that these express a way of life lived in true obedience to God, abstaining from self-indulgence and extending grace and well being to those in need. When this is done the light of God’s people fully shines in his glory as they enjoy a restored relationship with him.*

PSALM 112:1-10 - *The Psalmist affirms that those who fear The LORD and delight in his laws, especially supporting the poor, are firmly established in the midst of the changes and chances of life. They are a light in the darkness for those around them.*

MATTHEW 5:13-20 - *Jesus calls his followers both the salt of the earth and the light of the world. As we more fully keep the laws of God before a watching world, more and more glory is given to the Father and the prophetic vision of the kingdom of heaven comes closer to realization.*
