**Topic:** Hospitality    **Subtopic:** Show Justice, Mercy, Compassion

**Verses:** Zechariah 7:9-10 and James 2:15-17

## Your Plan This Week

- Use Monday to read **Zechariah 7:9-10** and **James 2:15-17** in their context. Reflect on their meaning and how to live them out in your life, church, and community. Notice that both of these passages are directed towards groups and their collective actions, not just individuals.
- Use Tuesday and Wednesday to memorize **Zechariah 7:9-10** and use Thursday and Friday to memorize **James 2:15-17**. Use the weekend to practice both passages and reflect on them.
- Take 15 to 20 minutes each day to review the verses you've already memorized.
- Talk with someone else who is working through the KIMS about these verses and their meaning for our life together.

## **Zechariah 7:9-10 NRSV**

**9 Thus says the Lord of hosts: Render true judgements, show kindness and mercy to one another; 10 do not oppress the widow, the orphan, the alien, or the poor; and do not devise evil in your hearts against one another.**

## **James 2:15-17 NRSV**

**15 If a brother or sister is naked and lacks daily food, 16 and one of you says to them, 'Go in peace; keep warm and eat your fill', and yet you do not supply their bodily needs, what is the good of that? 17 So faith by itself, if it has no works, is dead.**

## **Suggested Prayer for Week 8**
